POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO OUR HEARTS

(The Church's Witness of Brotherly Love) When a person truly knows Jesus Christ and believes in him, that person experiences his presence in life as well as the power of his resurrection, and cannot but communicate this experience. And if this person meets with misunderstanding or adversity, he behaves like Jesus in his passion: he answers with love and with the power of the truth....Let us ask for the help of Mary Most Holy so that the Church throughout the world may proclaim the resurrection of the Lord with candor and courage and give credible witness to it with signs of brotherly love. Brotherly love is the closest testimony we can give that Jesus is alive with us, that Jesus is risen.

The Gospel for this Sunday addresses the issue of love head on: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you." If we truly "get" this one statement—"As the Father loves me, so I also love you"—then everything else becomes mere window dressing.

Because what Jesus is telling us in this profound and dazzling Gospel reading is that you and I are loved in the same way and to the same extent that Jesus is loved by God the Father! It's breathtaking when you stop and think about it. Look back in the Gospels and see for yourself. All of the great stories Jesus ever told—the prodigal son, the Good Samaritan, the woman caught in adultery, the washing of the feet, the cleansing of the lepers, the curing of the blind and the lame—all of these tell the same single tale: Each of us is graciously, eternally and infinitely loved.

CHILD ABUSE AWARENESS

WEEK 5 Did you know...What is happening in the diocese to protect children? Training is provided for all adults and youth to identify warning signs and develop strategies for maintaining a safe environment for all. A designated Review Board Administrator and Victim Assistance Coordinator is available to receive reports and accompany victims through their journey. A volunteer independent Review Board assists the bishop in the review of cases and makes recommendations for moving forward. A Safe Environment

Coordinator assists parish and school personnel with training and background screenings for anyone who may have access to children. An audit is conducted by an independent firm to evaluate the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. Findings are incorporated with those of other dioceses and made available in an Annual Report.
